If a staff member sees or hears about a student protection concern the staff member must:

Take immediate protective action if the student is at immediate risk of harm from themselves or others; for example, administer first aid or contact emergency services if required [police or ambulance].



Contact one of the school's Student Protection Contacts (SPC) and explain what has been seen and/or heard and what actions have been taken so far. Be mindful of confidentiality and respecting the privacy of the student and others.

1. Talk to one of the six Student Protection Contacts at St Peter Claver College: Bruce McPhee, Todd Riggs, Amanda Pynenburg, Michelle Sams, Tracey Beck Gude and Alister Ballschmieter.
2. If you are unable to speak to a Student Protection Contact in person, please email at least two of the Student Protection Contacts and follow-up with a phone call to check the email has been received.
3. Please use the subject heading Student Protection Concern. DO NOT put students name into the subject heading. Assign email alert as high importance.



Follow the guidance of the SPC on what to do next. This may include:

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| 1. writing detailed notes about what you know | 4. completing a Record of Concern in the Student Protection Case Management System (SPCMS) |
| 2. discussing the concerns with another SPC/school leadership team member/BCE Student Protection Officer (SPO) | 5. discussing reporting obligations |
| 3. gathering additional information | |



Speak with the SPC/Guidance Counsellor/school leadership team member/pastoral or year coordinator about:

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| 1. pastoral care and support for the student and family | 2. immediate and/or longer-term safety and support planning |
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As a mandatory reporter staff have an obligation to report harm to a student. If the Principal/Delegate decides the concern does not meet a threshold for reporting to a state authority, and you disagree with this decision, please discuss your concerns with your Principal/Delegate immediately. Your school's BCE Student Protection Officer can assist with this discussion if required (Student Protection Team - Ph: 3033 7409).
